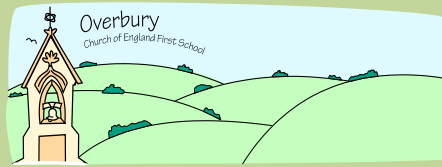

E-Safety No.1 MMO / MMORPG (Massively Multiplayer Online Roleplaying Games)

These have been around for a while and allow players to connect over the internet with other players and have fun. Some are not suitable for our children, like **COD (Call of Duty PEGI rated 18+)** where you take the role of a soldier in combat with very visceral graphics.

Please pay attention to the PEGI rating of the games your child plays,

and remember: **MMO's provide an opportunity for ANYONE to connect and play with your child.**

A suitable game, popular with our children from Tower to Sundial, is **Rocket League (PEGI 3+)**. In this game, you take control of colourful supercars that also happen to be playing football! It's chaotic, colourful and lots of fun; not to mention **free** to download! Games like **Rocket League** can be a good opportunity to pick up a controller and join in with your child; not only does this put them in the role of teacher (which they love) but it also opens dialogue about the games they are playing quite naturally.

In all of these cases, it is important the children play these games in a public space if possible (eg: living room). This allows adults to monitor what is being played and, *crucially*, said.
